

Lesson 6.2 Simple Subjects and Predicates

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EXERCISE 1 Writing Subjects and Predicates

Write the simple subject and simple predicate of each sentence. Label each.

EXAMPLE Have you seen an armadillo?

you (simple subject), Have seen (simple predicate)

- **1.** The animal's most striking feature is its shell.
- 2. An armadillo's bony shell covers its back.
- **3.** Some armadillos can roll themselves into a ball.

Hint

In many questions, the subject comes after a helping verb and before the main verb.

- **4.** Their diet includes insects, spiders, and little reptiles.
- **5.** Do these mammals like hot weather?

EXERCISE 2 Identifying Subjects and Predicates

Underline the simple subject of each sentence below once and the simple predicate, or verb, twice. Remember to underline any helping verbs in a verb phrase.

¹Armadillos enjoy water. ²The animals like the soft areas around streams and water holes. ³Their sharp claws can dig more easily for food in moist, soft soils. ⁴They also enjoy baths in muddy ponds. ⁵Do these creatures swim? ⁶Surprisingly, the answer is yes. ⁷They can do a silly-looking paddle for short distances.

⁸However, swimming tires them quickly. ⁹Luckily, armadillos can also gulp large amounts of air to inflate their stomachs and intestines. ¹⁰The extra air works like a built-in life preserver. ¹¹The animals stay afloat more easily this way. ¹²In addition, armadillos can walk across narrow streams, ponds, or water-filled ditches. ¹³Some armadillos may hold their breath for five or six minutes! ¹⁴Did you know that?
